Please complete the quiz we really value your views and want to use them to drive the direction of our school forward.









# Resilience - Final Unit - Expect the Unexpected

------

This term we launched our final Building Resilience unit. This unit is called 'Expect the Unexpected'. In this unit, we explore how we cannot protect ourselves from change (no matter how much we would like to) as it is part of life. Sometimes change can be a positive experience and sometimes it brings with it, disappointments, difficulties or loss. In this unit we will be learning that:

- Change is a part of life
- It's ok not to be ok
- I have learnt ways to look after my mental health

We will reflect on the 10 tools we have been learning about over the past three years. We know how to look after our physical health by doing things like brushing our teeth, exercising and trying to make healthy food choices. However, we must also ensure we are looking after our minds. As part of this work Mrs Grant, Ms White and Ms Carter took their after school engineering clubs to the Primary Engineering competition on the 23rd of May. Primary Engineer is a non profit company who encourages children and young people towards STEM careers through engineering. Exactly what our Science Prize entry is about.



Our after school Science Clubs worked hard to prepare for this competion. The hard work paid off as they came back to school as winners! We were the winner of Best theme, 1st place for Engineer Level 2 and 1st place for Apprentice Level 2. We could not be prouder.



Not only did our children need to complete a design for a specific brief and make it but they had to be interviewed by real engineers and fully explain their work.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank Ms Carter for leading our Science Prize work. We are of course already winners for being nominated as one of only six national finalists. 




# Session 2019 - 2020 Meet the Teacher
