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Empowered Learning



The Empowered Learning programme gives every school pupil from P6 to S6 in Edinburgh their own digital device as part of the ambitious and inclusive education strategy, Edinburgh Learns for Life.

By providing an iPad on a 1:1 level, we can ensure fair and equal access to digital technology at home or in class whilst improving engagement, attainment and dialogue. An iPad also provides core educational applications that can improve digital literacy skills.

Our Primary Six and Seven classes took delivery of our new iPads this week. Every child now has their own iPad to use in class. Children will be taught how to be safe online, how to research information as part of project work, as well as how to use tools to aid their learning. For children who experience a visual stress disorder, such as dyslexia, the features on the iPad (for example the dictation tool and the immersive reader tool) will be of particular benefit. The ipads provide a tool to create, store and share learning creatively.

Our Primary 7s have already honed their digital art skills using their iPads to create digital images for the Christmas cards they sold at the fair last week. All remaining classes have access to shared devices, and our teachers undertake regular professional development to ensure they have the skills to support the use of iPads in their teaching and learning.



The Primary 2 block will continue after Christmas and Primary 3 parents/carers keep an eye out for a block starting early 2023!





The main focus for this event was to show parents and carers our Concrete, Pictorial and Abstract approach to teaching Numeracy from Early (P1) to the end of Second Level (P7). We were blown away by the turn out for this event as we had 96 families join us to hear about the of importance of using concrete materials, strategy building and pupil participation. We also hoped you enjoyed being part of the lessons in our classrooms too. Thank you so much for the valuable feedback as always as this is crucial for our drive towards continuous improvement.

98% of parents and carers said they enjoyed the Numeracy session. 98% of parents and carers said they learned something about their child's Numeracy learning.




A new member of the Castleview Family

Miss Florence has been very busy putting her Cockapoo, Ozzy through Therapy Dog Training. In September he passed his assessment and is now a fully qualified Therapet!

There are lots of studies to show the positive effects that therapy animals can have when working with children.

These benefits include:



- Improvement of literacy and communication skills
- Develop pupil confidence and engagement in learning
- Relieves stress and pressure on pupils
- Improvement in school attendance
- Health benefits such as serotonin boosting and blood pressure lowering
- Reduces social isolation and loneliness.
- Encourages laughter and happiness our school value of Joy!

Ozzy will initially come into school in January and work with small groups of pupils with a focus on increasing pupil confidence and enjoyment in reading. Parents/Carers of pupils who will be involved in this will be contacted after the Christmas Break.

Ozzy is very excited to come in and meet some of the Castleview pupils. There will be a series of lessons that pupils will receive ahead of meeting Ozzy to ensure all pupils know how to act and treat a dog with respect. October Holiday Learning for Castleview Staff





In the October holidays, 12 staff members went to Nice, France, on a language immersion course. The reasoning behind this trip was to try and improve staff members confidence when speaking another language; their competence when navigating linguistic structures and knowledge of content that could be included in language lessons. As it was an immersion course, the whole week was conducted in French, so for those new to the language it was straight in at the deep end!

Staff members took part in language lessons every day. Each lesson taught them new French language and exciting games and songs to bring back to Castleview. They also went on cultural excursions around the area of France they visited to improve their knowledge of French traditions and customs. Perhaps one of their favourite parts of the week was visiting French schools. It was incredibly interesting to observe the similarities and differences between Castleview and the French system. The staff who went on the trip are working hard to create connections with these schools so that pupils can make similar observations too, so watch this space!

Since returning home, all the participants of the trip have led a training activity for teaching staff who didn't attend. They've shared their knowledge with their colleagues and are doing their best to promote a language learning ethos in our school. Although French is our third language at Castleview, all skills learnt on the trip are transferrable to Spanish (and even English) teaching too. As a school, we are so thankful to Erasmus+, the British Council and LFEE (Language for Education Europe) for funding and supporting our staff to organise this incredible opportunity. We sincerely hope our pupils and school community can feel the benefit of the excursion through our learning and teaching.
